- Spectacular Cradle Mountain and Dove Lake, visit Waldheim, enjoy lunch at the Cradle Mountain Hotel and the visual delights of the Wilderness Gallery.
- Get up close to the endangered Tasmanian Devil at Devils@Cradle.
- Tour the delightful small town of Sheffield with its colourful murals.
- Magnificent Cataract Gorge and picturesque Tamar Valley.
- Gold and Heritage Mine Museum at Beaconsfield.
- Visit Anvers Chocolate and Ashgrove Cheese.
- World Heritage Woolmers Estate and the National Rose Garden.
- Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery (QVMAG).



NOTES:

Health and Fitness: To assist us when booking, please advise your Spark Travel consultant if you have any special needs such as mobility, dietary etc.

****Health and Fitness: A minimum level of fitness is required in order to be able to participate.**

****Coach seating:** It should be noted that to be fair to all passengers, specific coach seats cannot be reserved.

****Flight seating:** Please note that on tours where flights are involved, the seating within the confines of the group is computer allocated alphabetically by the airlines and beyond the control of Spark Travel.

****Tour extensions subject to availability and extension booking criteria.**

CHAUFFEURED TRANSFERS TO AND FROM YOUR HOME:

Chauffeured transfers apply in the zoned area. These transfers may be available at additional cost to passengers who live outside the zoned area - please ask your Spark Travel consultant. 'HOME PICK UP SERVICE' will call you **two (2) days** before the commencement of the tour to confirm the time they will be arriving at your home. **If you have missed the call, please contact Spark Travel (08) 8876 5121 a day prior to departure** for your pickup time. **If you reside at a retirement village, please ensure Spark Travel have clear instructions from you as to means of entry and directions to find your home. If you are out of zone there will be an additional payment due, this should be made at the time of booking.** For safety reasons, suitcases should weigh no more than 20kgs. The Adelaide home pick up service only applies to scheduled tour departure and return tour dates. Those passengers wishing to extend their tours will be responsible for their own transfers.

ITINERARY:

DAY 01 – THURSDAY: ADELAIDE/LAUNCESTON/HOBART – HERITAGE HIGHWAY

This morning, meet with your Spark Travel Tour Manager at Adelaide Airport for your Virgin Australia flight to Launceston. You will need to produce photo ID on check in and will be issued with your boarding pass. Depart Adelaide on your Virgin Australia flight, arriving Launceston where you will be greeted by your Tasmanian Coach Captain and welcomed aboard your coach. Travel along the Heritage Highway, stopping on the way to visit the historic village of Ross, listed on the Register of the National Estate and noted for its historic bridge, original sandstone buildings and convict history. Cross the Tasman Bridge to Hobart City see historic Battery Point, Salamanca Place and the vibrant waterfront, then check into our accommodation for the next 2 nights.

OVERNIGHT: THE OLD WOOLSTORE APARTMENT HOTEL, HOBART. (D)

DAY 02 – FRIDAY: IN HOBART – FULL DAY TO TASMAN PENINSULA, PORT ARTHUR, RICHMOND VILLAGE

Travel via Sorrell and Midway Point to the Tasman Peninsula with its rugged coastline, take in majestic views from the lookout above picturesque Eaglehawk Neck and Pirates Bay before continuing to the ruins of the Port Arthur Convict Settlement. Within the 40 hectares of landscaped grounds lies a rich history of Australia's past. Included activities available are a guided walking tour, a short cruise across the harbour, access to the Visitor Centre and Interpretation Gallery as well as more than 30 buildings, ruins, restored gardens and houses. In the afternoon visit the magnificent geological features of Tasman Arch and Devil's Kitchen, carved out by the Tasman Sea. Spend time in Richmond Village, and view Australia's oldest Catholic Church, opened in 1837, where the town is home to reputedly the oldest stone bridge in Australia (still in use). The bridge was built in 1823 using convict labour and is shrouded in tales of mystery, hardship and tragedy. Visit Rosny Lookout for panoramic views of Hobart against the backdrop of the Wellington Range.

OVERNIGHT: THE OLD WOOLSTORE APARTMENT HOTEL, HOBART. (B,D)

DAY 03 – SATURDAY: HOBART/QUEENSTOWN – SALAMANCA MARKET, DERWENT VALLEY, 'WALL IN THE WILDERNESS,' WEST COAST

Saturday morning in Hobart means the famous **Salamanca open-air Market** with its bustle, buskers, colour and excitement. Be swept up in a sea of colour, creativity and culinary delights where more than 300 stalls fill the street selling art, craft and other hand-made goodies.

Departing Hobart mid-morning, tour the picturesque **Derwent Valley** through **New Norfolk** to climb the Central Plateau, past trout lakes, through mountains and gorges and the **Wild Rivers National Park**. After lunch at **Tarraleah**, we visit the simply stunning sculpture '**Wall in the Wilderness**,' three metre high wooden panels, carved by wood sculptor **Greg Duncan** tells the history of the harsh Central Highlands region. Take a short walk through the stunning Tasmanian cool temperate rainforest to visit the beautiful **Nelson Falls** and finally cross **Lake Burbury**, descending through the ghost towns of **Linda** and **Gormanston** to the copper mining town of **Queenstown**, our home for the next two nights.

OVERNIGHT: THE GOLD RUSH MOTOR INN, QUEENSTOWN. (B,L,D)

DAY 04 – SUNDAY: IN QUEENSTOWN – STRAHAN, MACQUARIE HARBOUR, GORDON RIVER CRUISE

This morning, we cruise the incomparable **Gordon River** into the heart of Tasmania's wilderness and the edge of World Heritage. Enjoy comfortable main deck window seating on board the extraordinary vessel, **Harbour Master II**. Step ashore at **Sarah Island**, for a **guided tour** of the harshest penal settlements in Australia. Follow the Gordon through stands of ancient Huon pine, Sassafras and Myrtle rainforest, to step ashore to explore the boardwalk at **Heritage Landing**. Voyage to **Hell's Gates**, the aptly named harbour entrance where many early ships were destroyed by ferocious ocean swells. At **Strahan** there will be an opportunity to explore the village including the **Visitor Centre** and **Huon Pine Sawmill**. A **light lunch** provided today.

OVERNIGHT: THE GOLD RUSH MOTOR INN, QUEENSTOWN. (B,L,D)

DAY 05 – MONDAY: QUEENSTOWN/DEVONPORT – CRADLE MOUNTAIN, DOVE LAKE, DEVILS@CRADLE, NORTH WEST, MURALS OF SHEFFIELD

This morning, traverse the **Reid Volcanic Zone** for views of the Tyndall Range and Lake Plimsoll enroute to **Tullah** where we will take a short break. Continuing North through rainforest and mineral rich mountains, crossing the **Vale of Belvoir** and alpine cattle country to reach **Cradle Mountain National Park**. Enjoy a **guided tour** of **Dove Lake** at the foot of the crags of **Cradle Mountain** and visit **Waldheim**, forest home of pioneer Gustav Weindorfer. Enjoy **lunch** and the visual delights of the **Wilderness Gallery** at the **Cradle Mountain Hotel** before getting up close and personal with the endangered **Tasmanian Devil** at **Devils@Cradle**. Later continue on through mountains and button grass plains to the North West coast. Visit the scenic **North West** murals town of **Sheffield**, where a tiny community has recorded their history and honoured their pioneers in huge paintings on the town walls.

OVERNIGHT: NOVOTEL HOTEL, DEVONPORT. (B,L,D)

DAY 06 – TUESDAY: DEVONPORT/LAUNCESTON – ANVERS CHOCOLATE, ASHGROVE CHEESE, CATARACT GORGE, BEACONSFIELD GOLD MINE

This morning, travel along the Bass Highway to **Anvers Chocolates**, visit the museum and gift shop and enjoy tastings of the award-winning hand-made truffles. Next, onto the **Ashgrove Farm Cheese Dairy Door**, before continuing on through rural countryside to the northern city of **Launceston**. Highlights include a visit to magnificent **Cataract Gorge** with its rhododendron gardens, peacocks, pools, suspension foot-bridge and one of the longest single-span chair lifts in the world (*ride is optional at own cost*). Viewing the picturesque **Tamar Valley** during travel to **Beaconsfield** – site of the mine disaster and miraculous rescue. Visit the **Beaconsfield Gold Mine and Heritage Museum** and stand on the platform to view the site where the rescued miners emerged before we check into our hotel.

OVERNIGHT: HOTEL GRAND CHANCELOR, LAUNCESTON. (B,D)

DAY 07 – WEDNESDAY: IN LAUNCESTON – WOOLMERS ESTATE & NATIONAL ROSE GARDEN, QUEEN VICTORIA MUSEUM AND ART GALLERY (QVMAG)

This morning, visit the **World Heritage Woolmers Estate** and the **National Rose Garden**. This property shows a fascinating reflection of colonial life in Tasmania with the **National Rose Garden** displaying one of the finest collections of historic roses in the Southern Hemisphere.

After an informative guided tour, we enjoy **lunch at Woolmers Café & Restaurant**. This afternoon, visit Northern Tasmania's home of art, history and natural science – the **Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery (QVMAG)**. The collection has been in the making since 1842. The **Olgas Truchananas** wilderness photography exhibition and **Tasmanian Tiger** exhibit will be of special interest. Later enjoy free time to relax - maybe take a walk through the beautiful Launceston City Park, go shopping or just relax back at our hotel before enjoying **dinner** at a local restaurant.

OVERNIGHT: HOTEL GRAND CHANCELOR, LAUNCESTON. (B,L,D)

DAY 08 – THURSDAY: LAUNCESTON/ADELAIDE – EVANDALE & LUNCH

This morning after breakfast we check out and head off to the village of **Evandale**, one of Tasmania's earliest and best preserved settlements from the Victorian era. Take a stroll down High Street to admire the 19th Century architecture and enjoy time to explore the shops and an opportunity to purchase locally made Tasmanian products. Enjoy a final **lunch** together at the iconic **Clarendon Arms Hotel** before we head off to Launceston Airport to begin the journey home.

On arrival at **Launceston Airport** we check in for our return Virgin Australia flight to **Adelaide**. Please have your **photo ID** ready for presentation after which you will receive your boarding pass. **(B,L)**

ITINERARIES:

Itineraries are subject to change and no responsibility can be accepted. Coach operator and size of coach may be changed at the discretion of Spark Travel without notice. Where a tour does not meet minimum numbers travelling together on the outward journey a cost surcharge will apply. If group numbers fall below 15 adult paying passengers no tour leader will be provided. No itemisation of tour arrangements can be given and no refund for any portion of a tour not taken. ACCOMMODATION:

Spark Travel reserves the right to alter hotel/motel accommodation and to substitute a suitable alternative.

HEALTH AND FITNESS:

A minimum level of fitness is required in order to be able to participate. As a minimum you will need to be able to walk up a flight of stairs and manage coach steps unaided. You must inform us before the commencement of the tour of any medical condition which may affect your ability to participate in the tour. Dietary requests must be accompanied by the appropriate dietary information. To protect yourself and fellow travellers, vaccination against Covid-19 is recommended.

FUEL SURCHARGES AND TAXES:

All bookings may attract additional fuel surcharges and taxes which can be levied up to and including the date of departure even if final payment has been made. Booking is subject to final audit.

SECURITY DEPOSIT:

A non-refundable security deposit of **\$675.00 per person (inc GST)** is required within five (5) days of booking.

FINAL PAYMENTS:

The security deposit forms part of the total price, the balance of which is due 60 days prior to departure, or in the case of bookings made within that 60 day period, the final payment is due as soon as the booking is confirmed.

LATE BOOKINGS AND AMENDMENTS:

Bookings made within 7 days inclusive of departure will incur a **late booking fee of \$75.00 per person**. Late bookings subject to availability. Once a booking has been made a **\$75.00 per person amendment fee** will apply for any alterations on selected departures only, and if applicable, one (1) change only to that booking. Transfers to other tours not permitted.

CREDIT CARDS:

If paying by credit card, a surcharge applies of 2% for Visa and Mastercard.

CANCELLATION CONDITIONS:

- i) We act as an Agent; and
- ii) That our Terms and Conditions are in addition to the Terms and Conditions of each Travel supplier listed on the quote itinerary; and
- iii) That it is the Terms and Conditions of the Travel supplier that determine the terms of cancellation and refunds, if any.
