YOUR ACCOMMODATION ON NORFOLK ISLAND:

The **Paradise Hotel and Resort** is a charming and popular resort, nestled in beautifully landscaped grounds and handy to the Norfolk Island Burnt Pine tax-free shopping centre and restaurants. All rooms are tastefully appointed, fan-cooled with private facilities, telephone, tea/coffee making facilities, TV, iron/ironing board, self-serve guest laundry. The property's other facilities include The Garden Restaurant and cocktail bar – a great place to meet people and chat, complimentary all day tea and coffee station, and a delightful outdoor swimming pool set in lush colonial gardens. Free computer access is available in the hotel lobby and personal wifi is available for purchase from Reception.



NOTES:

Health and Fitness: To assist us when booking, please advise your Spark Travel consultant if you have any special needs such as mobility, dietary etc.

****Health and Fitness:** A minimum level of fitness is required in order to be able to participate.

Please inform us at the time of booking of any medical conditions that may affect your ability to participate in the tour. If there are any changes to your medical condition after booking, you must notify us before the commencement of the tour. **If you are unable to manage on your own, it will be necessary to be accompanied by another person who is fit and able to assist you.**

****Dietary requests:** Must be accompanied by the appropriate dietary information in writing. It should be noted that meals are in a group situation and we will do our best to comply with any pre-advised dietary requirements.

Coach seating: It should be noted that to be fair to all passengers, specific coach seats cannot be reserved. Maximum coach size on tour is a 22 seater (not toilet-equipped).

****Flight seating:** Please note that on tours where flights are involved, the seating within the confines of the group is computer allocated alphabetically by the airlines and beyond the control of Spark Travel.

Itinerary: At the time of your tour departure some inclusions could be on a different day from that displayed in the itinerary – this is known as 'Island Time.'

****Tour extensions** subject to availability and extension booking criteria.

CHAUFFEURED TRANSFERS TO AND FROM YOUR HOME:

Chauffeured transfers apply in the zoned area. These transfers may be available at additional cost to passengers who live outside the zoned area - please ask your Spark Travel consultant. 'HOME PICK UP SERVICE' will call you **two (2) days before** the commencement of the tour to confirm the time they will be arriving at your home. **If you have missed the call, please contact Spark Travel (08) 8876 5121 a day prior to departure** for your pickup time. **If you reside at a retirement village, please ensure Spark Travel have clear instructions from you as to means of entry and directions to find your home.** **If you are out of zone there will be an additional payment due, this should be made at the time of booking.** For safety reasons, suitcases should weigh no more than 20kgs. The Adelaide home pick up service only applies to scheduled tour departure and return tour dates. Those passengers wishing to extend their tours will be responsible for their own transfers.

DOCUMENTATION:

All visitors to Norfolk Island must have either a **valid passport or alternative valid Australian official photo ID** such as a current driver's licence or state ID card – the alternative photo ID for entry is new and **not recommended** as we have been advised *there can be considerable delays in re-entering Australia* whilst a person's immigration status is confirmed.

At the time of booking your tour, **please ensure that your document name provided is exactly as per your Passport or photo ID (first and last name).** Any re-issue of travel documents due to incorrect name will incur the relevant amendment fee. **If you have a preferred name for your nametag, please also advise this at the time of booking.**

ITINERARY:

DAY 01 – ADELAIDE/BRISBANE

Don't forget your valid Passport or alternative Photo ID!

Depart **Adelaide Airport** on your Qantas Domestic flight to Brisbane. Transfer by shuttle from Brisbane Domestic Terminal to accommodation.

OVERNIGHT: IBIS BRISBANE AIRPORT (D)

DAY 02 – BRISBANE/NORFOLK ISLAND

After **breakfast** at the Ibis Brisbane Airport, transfer to **Brisbane International Terminal** for your **Qantas International flight to Norfolk Island.**

On arrival at **Norfolk Island** our local representative from **Baunti Tours** will meet and transfer you to the **Paradise Hotel and Resort**, your home for the next **7 nights**. Enjoy time to settle in and relax before **dinner**. (B,D)

DAY 03 – ON NORFOLK ISLAND – EMILY BAY & ORIENTATION TOUR, MUSEUMS TOUR, TRIAL OF THE FIFTEEN

This morning after breakfast, depart on an informative **Orientation Tour**, then down to beautiful **Emily Bay** for a delightful **light lunch**. As you journey around the Island, your **driver/guide** will relate Norfolk's intriguing history of the first convict settlement from 1788 to the present day, and home of the descendants of the Bounty Mutineers. Journey to the historic area of **Kingston**, site of perhaps the best collection of **Georgian architecture** in the Southern Hemisphere. Drive up to the picturesque **Queen Elizabeth Lookout** for a wonderful photo opportunity, then north to the old whaling and landing area of **Cascades** before a leisurely return to **Burnt Pine** after a final stop to explore beautiful **St Barnabas Church**.

After a delightful **picnic lunch**, we then do the exciting and interesting **Museums excursion**. First visit the **Pier Store** – for the **true story of the Mutiny on the Bounty** and the resettlement of the Pitcairn population to Norfolk Island, then on to the **HMS Sirius Museum**, one of Australia's most important shipwrecks. Finally we visit **No. 10 Quality Row**, built in 1844 for Thomas Seller, Foreman of Works during the height of the brutal 2nd settlement. This is a beautiful fully furnished colonial home of the era.

Our last excursion of the day will be the '**Trial of the Fifteen**.' Be transported back in time for a memorable journey through Norfolk's unique past as the cast portrays 15 colourful characters from Norfolk's history.

Dinner provided tonight. **(B,L,D)**

DAY 04 – ON NORFOLK ISLAND – NORFOLK TODAY TOUR, TASTE OF NORFOLK TOUR, ISLAND FISH FRY

Today we begin with the modern tour, **Norfolk Today**, to learn how Norfolk Islanders live in the 21st Century and the essential services which make life possible on a tiny South Pacific Island. To see what makes Norfolk 'tick,' learn how the Islanders reap the ocean's bounty, bring fuel and gas to the Island, power their world, deal with waste and forecast the weather – the Norfolk Today tour will make it all clear!

After free time for your own lunch break, we head off to the **Taste of Norfolk Tour**. Meet firsthand passionate local producers including Norfolk Island Liqueurs, a local beekeeper, tastings with seasonal fruits, taste salt made from the ocean and finish with a demonstration and tasting of Tahitian traditional dishes.

This evening enjoy the **Island Fish Fry**. Enjoy Island style fish served with a selection of delicious salads and desserts, followed by Tahitian style entertainment. **(B,D)**

DAY 05 – ON NORFOLK ISLAND – AUTHOR COLLEEN MCCULLOUGH'S HOME, GLASS BOTTOM BOAT, PROGRESSIVE DINNER

Visit the home of the late world-renowned author **Colleen McCullough**. Colleen created an amazing majestic home on Norfolk Island with her husband Ric Robinson. This is an exclusive escorted tour through Ric and Colleen's home to view some of their priceless collections from around the world.

This afternoon travel to **Emily Bay** to view the marine delights of one of the most southern lagoon reefs in the Pacific on our **Glass Bottom Boat tour** (time and day for this is flexible, dependent on weather and tides). Your local guide will provide interesting commentary on the history of Emily and Slaughter Bays.

Tonight we head out to the unique 3 course **Progressive Dinner** - meet local families and enjoy warm Island hospitality, whilst being welcomed into their homes. **(B,D)**

DAY 06 – ON NORFOLK ISLAND – PITCAIRN SETTLERS VILLAGE, CYCLORAMA, SOUND & LIGHT SHOW

This morning a real treat is in store. We will walk next door for an experience at the **Pitcairn Settlers Village**, home of the Christian-Bailey family. First settled by Charles Christian-Bailey's great great grandparents Emily Christian and George Bailey, the property has been continuously owned by the same family. Visit the 1879 Bailey family homestead, visit the oldest working forge in the Pacific and enjoy the spectacular gardens. Travelling for part of the tour will be on the Island's first tour bus, a 1928 Model A Ford truck!

Enjoy a **light lunch** today at the hotel and in your remaining free time, walk next door to use your entry ticket to **Fletcher's Mutiny Cyclorama** – a 360 degree panoramic painting of how the world's most famous mutiny on **HMS Bounty** created the **Pitcairn and Norfolk communities**. Two local artists took 16 months to paint the Cyclorama and with an evocative soundtrack by musician **Rick Robertson**, history comes to life – the Cyclorama will also help

with understanding the Pitcairn Settlers Village story.

After **dinner at the hotel**, we transfer to the **Pinetree Sound and Light Show**. This is a must for the history lover with a sense of the dramatic! Nightfall at Kingston brings a different mood to the Convict Settlement with the dramatic use of real life sound, together with theatrical lighting and costumed actors as you are taken through the decades of Norfolk Island's horrific convict era. **(B,L,D)**

DAY 07 – ON NORFOLK ISLAND – NORFOLK SUNDAY MARKETS, CONVICT KINGSTON TOUR, 'WHO KILLED THE SURVEYOR' MURDER MYSTERY DINNER

This morning time will be allowed to browse the **Norfolk Island Sunday Markets** at leisure - very popular with visitors for the local handicrafts. Those passengers who would like to attend the service at St Barnabas Church will be dropped off and collected again after the service. After a **light lunch** back at our hotel, we return to **Kingston** with our local driver/guide to take in the **Convict Kingston tour**. Learn about the history of the various settlements of Norfolk Island, and how those settlements lived and survived - the Polynesians, the first European settlement of 1788, the convict penal settlement of 1825, and the arrival of the Pitcairn Islanders in 1856, visit the historic Convict cemetery. Tonight, enjoy **'Who Killed the Surveyor' Murder Mystery Dinner** at the elegantly restored Georgian house at No.9 Quality Row. As you enjoy a complimentary glass of wine and a 3 course dinner, hosted by 'Chief Magistrate Frederick Young' and his wife Mary,' help solve the mystery of the murder of the young surveyor from Sydney who was found washed up near Point Hunter. **(B,L,D)**

DAY 08 – ON NORFOLK ISLAND – FREE MORNING, AFTERNOON – NORFOLK CULTURE TOUR, DINNER AT HILLI RESTAURANT

This morning is free at leisure to maybe take the **complimentary hotel shuttle** down to Burnt Pine for some last minute exploring or shopping. Perhaps visit **Adam & Jenny at the delightful Norfolk Art**, shop in Taylors Road, or the duty free Bond Store - (take your Qantas ticket and photo ID with you) or for those with a 'sweet tooth,' 'Sweeties' has some great products. This afternoon we take the **Norfolk Island Culture Tour**, be immersed in the Island's rich cultural heritage, from the first Polynesian Settlement through to the arrival of the Pitcairn Islanders, the whaling days and to life today. See a Tapa beating and weaving demonstration, hold history in your hands with relics of the past, fish brining and smoking with tastings and much more.

This evening, it is a short walk next door to the charming **Hilli Restaurant** for a delightful 2 course dinner and a complimentary beer, wine or soft drink of your choice. **(B,D)**

DAY 09 – NORFOLK ISLAND/BRISBANE/ADELAIDE – ANSON BAY & CAPTAIN COOK MEMORIAL

Today we say farewell to **Norfolk Island**. Bags will need to be down in Reception after breakfast. We will join our Baunti coach for a delightful final excursion to **Anson Bay** to view the **Captain Cook Memorial** with **morning tea included**. Later we return to our hotel for a **light lunch**, then collect our bags and transfer to Norfolk Island Airport for the journey home. Board **Qantas flight from Norfolk Island to Brisbane**.

After clearing Customs and Immigration, we transfer to our accommodation in Brisbane.

DAY 10 – BRISBANE/ADELAIDE

After **breakfast** at our hotel, transfer to **Brisbane Domestic Airport** for our morning **Qantas flight to Adelaide**. **(B)**

TRAVEL INSURANCE:

EVENTS BEYOND THE CONTROL OF SPARK TRAVEL:

Should an event occur which is beyond the control of Spark Travel, ie: delays to ship, aircraft, train, coach thereby incurring extra expenses, these additional costs are borne by the passenger at the time of the event. A travel insurance claim for reimbursement should be submitted to the insurance company upon return home. Please keep any receipts. It should be understood that neither Spark Travel nor any subsidiary company or representative shall be liable for any loss, injury or damage arising from our services.

ITINERARIES:

Itineraries are subject to change and no responsibility can be accepted. Coach operator and size of coach may be changed at the discretion of Spark Travel without notice. Where a tour does not meet minimum numbers travelling together on the outward journey a cost surcharge will apply. If group numbers fall below 12 adult paying passengers no tour leader will be provided. No itemisation of tour arrangements can be given and no refund for any portion of a tour not taken. Flora and fauna as described in an itinerary is nature and as such cannot be guaranteed.

ACCOMMODATION:

Spark Travel reserves the right to alter hotel/motel accommodation and to substitute a suitable alternative.

HEALTH AND FITNESS:

A minimum level of fitness is required in order to be able to participate. As a minimum you will need to be able to walk up a flight of stairs and manage coach steps unaided. You must inform us before the commencement of the tour of any medical condition which may affect your ability to participate in the tour. Dietary requests must be accompanied by the appropriate dietary information. It is recommended masks be worn on flights and in crowded or inside spaces. To protect yourself and fellow travellers, vaccination against Covid-19 is recommended.

FUEL SURCHARGES AND TAXES:

All bookings may attract additional fuel surcharges and taxes which can be levied up to and including the date of departure even if final payment has been made. Booking is subject to final audit.

SECURITY DEPOSIT:

A non-refundable security deposit of **\$675.00 per person (inc GST)** is required within five (5) days of booking.

FINAL PAYMENTS:

The security deposit forms part of the total price, the balance of which is due 60 days prior to departure, or in the case of bookings made within that 60 day period, the final payment is due as soon as the booking is confirmed.

LATE BOOKINGS AND AMENDMENTS:

Bookings made within 7 days inclusive of departure will incur a **late booking fee of \$75.00 per person**. Late bookings subject to availability. Once a booking has been made a **\$75.00 per person amendment fee** will apply for any alterations on selected departures only, and if applicable, one (1) change only to that booking. Transfers to other tours not permitted.

CREDIT CARDS:

If paying by credit card, a surcharge applies of 2% for Visa and Mastercard.

CANCELLATION CONDITIONS:

- i) We act as an Agent; and
- ii) That our Terms and Conditions are in addition to the Terms and Conditions of each Travel supplier listed on the quote itinerary; and
- iii) That it is the Terms and Conditions of the Travel supplier that determine the terms of cancellation and refunds, if any.

BOOKINGS CANCELLED AFTER THE FINAL PAYMENT HAS BEEN MADE:
